#### Slavery ... today ?

More than 200 years after the abolition of the slave trade there are still an estimated 40.3 million men, women and children trapped in modern slavery, at least 13,000 potential victims in the UK alone. Human trafficking is very real and hidden in plain sight, in our communities, in your city, town and even village.

Most commonly people are trafficked into forced labour in industries such as agriculture, construction, hospitality, manufacturing and car washes. Many women and girls are trafficked for sexual exploitation.

Many people, again mostly women and girls, also end up in domestic slavery. Others, particularly children, are forced into crime such as cannabis production, petty theft or begging.

Many charities and organisations are working to end modernday slavery, to work with its victims i.e. <u>The Clewer Initiative</u> Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby says '*William Wilberforce convinced his generation that slavery was a sin. That belief has not changed. The sin lies in our ignorance to its existence around us. With this in mind I am delighted that the Church of England has set up the Clewer Initiative to help detect instances of modern slavery and to provide care to its victims.*' The current campaign is Safe Car Wash - read more how you can get involved <u>here</u>.
