# Understanding UMS points AS \& A Level <br> for modular style courses 

## UMS= Uniform Mark Scale

When you sit an exam or do a piece of coursework, these are marked or moderated by an examiner who will allocate a Raw Mark. This Raw Mark is then converted by the Exam Boards into UMS points which are shown on the Statement of Results. These UMS points will indicate what equivalent grade you have achieved for that unit. Each unit may have a different maximum Uniform Mark so you will need to ask your subject teacher what it is for their subject or you can look it up on Moodle Examinations.
The table below indicates the UMS grade boundary.

E.G.: If you achieved 65 UMS points out of a possible 105, then your unit grade will be C.

These UMS points are then added together to produce an overall Award Grade for either AS or A2. If you have done a resit, the best unit results will be used. The table below shows the boundaries for overall Award Grades depending on the number of units required for a whole A Level Award.

6 unit GCE A Level include Maths, Travel and Tourism, Music, Health and Social Care, Geology, Physics, Chemistry, Biology.
E.G.: If you did Psychology AS, which is a 4 unit GCE, and you achieved 75/100(b) for one unit and 42/100(e) for another, your overall UMS points will be 117/200 therefore, looking at Table 2, you will have gained an overall AS grade D.
Please note that the $A^{*}$ for Maths A Level is based on different criteria and should be checked with the Subject Teacher
